Important information about exams

- Written tests are open book and online
- You must sign up online for the practical video exams, 1 week to 3 days prior to the scheduled date
- You have one hour to take the test. You may exit to take a break between sections
- Organize your study material in olympic order. There are 5 sections
 - General deductions
 - Vault
 - Bars
 - Beam
 - Floor
- 50 questions total
- You must score 70% to pass
- You can attempt 4 times per year (written and video)
- Test A for your first try and then Test B for your second try
- Results will be received by email in minutes
- Once you pass, you will be reimbursed for you First attempts only
- You will also be reimbursed for USAG and NGA memberships
 - Only for the first year
 - Also reimbursed for 1 USAG rule book and one NGA rule book
- If you volunteer for IN judges cup, your NAWGJ will be paid each year you volunteer
- Go to gymjas.com to put in personal info and fill out availability
